Part time nursery children

9am to 11am (morning session) and 1pm to 3pm (afternoon session)

Full time nursery children 8.55am to 3pm

8.55am to 3.05pm - Foundation classes (Reception, Year 1 and 2)

8.55am to 3.10pm - Junior classes (Years 3, 4, 5 and 6)

- School milk is provided free of charge to all children up to year 2.
- We operate a cashless payment system in Oldcastle. Payment for fruit, trips and after school club can be made through our Parent Pay system. You will be provided with unique log in details when your child starts school.

Welcome to our Nursery

We welcome both you and your child to Oldcastle Nursery. We want to make this experience seamless and within this leaflet you will find information to help you settle into our School.

At the beginning of each day please bring your child to the Nursery door. To help your child settle into school, and become aware of our daily routines, you may come into the cloakroom and help your child find their name peg to hang their belongings on. At the end of the school day, please return back to the Nursery door and wait for the children to be dismissed by a member of the Nursery team.

To ensure independence and confidence please can clothing be easy for your child to undo. This will help when your child uses the toilet and changes for P.E. lessons.

Each child is provided with their own coat hook. Due to a lack of space, please do not send in toys or additional bags. It is essential to place your child's name on all items of clothing.

Lunch (when children are full time)

Children can choose to have school dinners or a packed lunch. Dinner money is to be paid using Bridgend County Borough Council's online system. Further information will be provided during our playday sessions in September. Please could all packed lunches be in a sealed container / bag and all clearly labelled.

Things to remember:-

- Water bottle (daily)
- Hat for summer months
- Wellies for outside activities (these can be left in school)
- Spare clothes in case of soiling in a labelled bag (to be kept in school)

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School Uniform

The school uniform is intended to be smart and practical, as well as making life easier when getting ready for school in the morning.

We hope children will be proud of their school and want to be seen in the uniform which consists of:

Boys: Navy sweatshirt, red or white polo shirt, grey or black trousers / shorts, black shoes.

Girls: Navy sweatshirt or cardigan, red or white polo shirt, navy or grey skirt, pinafore or trousers / shorts, black shoes.

Badged uniform can be purchased from Euroschoools, Uniform2Go, Tesco online embroidery service or other local stockists.

All clothing, footwear and lunchboxes must be clearly marked with the child's name.

Starting school will be easier if your child can do the following:

Use a knife and fork



Put their coat on
Get dressed / undressed



Talk to others and express
their needs



Go to the toilet
independently and wash
their hands
